Teacher and Principal (? – 1947). Not much is known about Miss Clough personally, such as her hometown, or what year she began teaching in Wright City. We know that between 1940 – 1942 she taught Home Economics and Science; she even coached the girls' basketball at least one year (1942). In 1943, she was promoted to the position of principal for the school district, quite an achievement for a female teacher educator during this period. She continued teaching both Science and Home Economics during her time as Principal as well.

The Alumni currently has no yearbooks between 1934-1939 (we do have 1933's). Due to not having this information, it is only presumed that Miss Clough may have begun teaching in Wright City prior to 1940, but we are unsure of the actual year.

She either retired or left the school district following the 1947 school year but was dedicated by the Class of 1948 in their yearbook, the following year after her leaving.

She received her Bachelor of Science in education from Lindenwood College, St. Charles, Mo. (Now Lindenwood University). She also attended the University of Chicago and Missouri University (Columbia, Mo.) working towards her master's degree in education. Miss Clough showed to have many talents as an educator with quite an educational background for this period. She undoubtedly was a great teacher, administrator, and friend to all the students during her time here.
