




ADOTHER YEAR




School officially started on August 26, 1991 with student enrollment at 292 compared to 240 of last year. Upon arrival, students noticed changes both inside and outside of the building. The full length windows that were once used in classrooms were replaced by new walls with just two center windows in order to become energy efficient. Smoking was banished from inside the school buildings, and the teacher's smoking lounge no longer exist.





This year Wright City High School has a new program called the Agricultural Occupational Experience program (AOE). While taking part in the program students receive training to use in future career positions. In addition students also receive 1 credit for working 15 hours a week and 2 credits for working 20 hours a week.

David Cook, teacher in

charge of the program says, "It's a really great program. I encourage a lot of students to join."

The contents of the course include good work ethics, expectations of employer and employee, and the study of good goal setting. Students learn that in the real world they will have to put a lot of effort into their job if they expect to keep it.



Mr. Cook, the sponsor of FFA said,"The blood drive was outstanding. There were 25 first time donors and 30 of the 80 donors were students."











The starters for the alumni were Tom Nailor, Andrew Marley, George Mozee, Curtis Forest, and Korey Gerdeman.


For the Wright City var-









Production of the book ran smoothly due to the hard work of the staff. Each student designed several two-page spreads which consisted of drawing layouts and



















The Club also worked on acting skills and performance of dramatic literature. A play was presented by the members in the spring.


