Echo, volume 70, was produced by the yearbook class at Wright City High School in Wright City, Missouri and printed by Herff Jones Yearbooks at the plant in Marceline, Missouri. The account was serviced by HJ representative Leah Blase. Ms. Jill McGuire served as the Yearbook adviser, the person who teaches the class. McGuire and the Editor-in Chief, Sara Tinker attended a summer yearbook workshop at UMSL, where they learned new skills and trends, and did activities to get a head start on this year's book. There they chose the theme - From a Different Perspective, and designed the cover with the aid of a professional artist. The yearbook staff also included co-editor and photographer Tara Mueller, copy editor Shannon Walters, layout editor Kendra Huddleston, business manager LeighAnn Kempffer, photographer Jamie Hynek, and sales manager Dave Cramberg. All staff members were responsible for the design and creation of pages using PageMaker 6.5. Echo has 128 pages that consist of 8 full color pages, 10 spot color pages, and 110 black \& white pages. The 8 full color pages are located in the Student Life section on pages 02-15; the 10 spot color pages are located in the Senior section on pages 84-94. Articles were eliminated this year in order to allow more space for photos, which are more memorable years later. When all of the pages were finished, the computerprinted layouts and pictures were put in envelopes, and shipped through Fed Ex to the plant. Staff members shot more than 120 rolls of color film using two Cannon Rebel G cameras. All of the film processing was done through Wal-Mart. Lifetouch provided all of the portraits, sports, and club pictures, as well as some candids from several games and events. The books were sold for $\$ 45.00$.
